APPEAL for CLEANING PRODUCTS

As a result of COVID19 restrictions and the continuing Australian Government denial of support to asylum seekers, increasing numbers of these most vulnerable people are now facing poverty and destitution. The Brigidine Asylum Seeker Project helps many of these people with accommodation, food and other necessities. Their stocks of cleaning products are very low so we are asking parishioners to donate kitchen, bathroom or laundry goods. You are invited to buy an extra product or two with your weekly shopping and put it into the baskets which will be in the foyer of the church on the weekends of 8 and 15 November. Given the limited number of people able to attend Mass, members of the SJG will be in the foyer of the church to accept your donations at each Mass (4.30 – 6.30pm Saturday and 8.30 – 10.30am Sunday).

Supporting our Parish and Priests

During this COVID-19 pandemic, we have all been severely impacted and our masses and sacraments have stopped. Many parishioners have not been able to attend a mass since late March – nearly seven months. However, Parish bills still need to be paid and the upkeep of our Priests need to be funded.

As you are no doubt aware, the first collection at mass -the Presbytery offering - goes to the upkeep of our Priests, including the payment of their stipends. The second Planned Giving collection supports the Parish in all of its activities.

Since the start of this year, the Planned Giving collection has received about half its usual amount, mainly due to the established direct debit arrangements with many Parishioners, but the Parish's bills have continued. As a result, we are forecasting to incur a modest loss this calendar year. Thank you to all those Parishioners who have contributed during this COVID-19 time.

In contrast, the Presbytery Offering has received very little over the past seven months with the bank account now containing insufficient money to support our Priests over coming months while Church services are severely restricted.
