



This year each week of "Lent at Home" will focus on ways of speaking about or imaging God.



LENT is a time of prayer, of self-restraint and of giving to others who are in need. It is a traditional time for going to Mass on weekdays and for setting aside time to pray.

It also asks us to look into our own lives, to set out things which need improvement or restraint and to do something about them.

Above all else it is a time to emphasize our relationship with God who will lead us to have concern for other people.

RESULTS OF PARISH SURVEY :

The Parish Leadership Group looked at the sheets handed in as part of the Parish survey conducted in December last year. There were 54 response sheets representing 83 people.

Regarding Mass times, 41 people wanted Mass times to remain as they are.

The suggested alternatives were so varied as not to provide solid convenient alternatives. There were several other suggestions with significant support that the Leadership team will follow up on :

Hearing Aid Loops; height adjustable seats, cushions for pews, adjustment of the microphone used by the priest. There were other suggestions which had very small (one or two) proponents. These were looked at but were often practically impossible.
