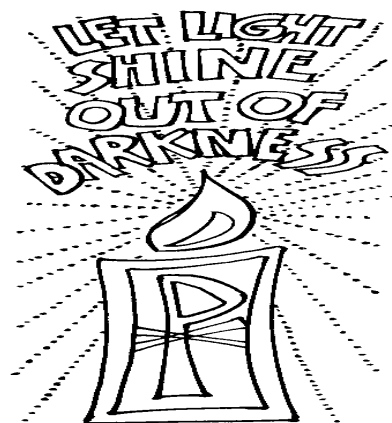

Mercy Health held a regular two-monthly meeting last week with parishioners who are the Friends of Fernhill. They advise that the project is on schedule and expected to be available for residents around the start of 2015.

Following Bayside Council's change to planning requirements for the area in which the Aged Care Facility is being built, Mercy are expecting a VCAT decision in August on an additional set-back fourth floor to increase accommodation to 120 residents.

The Sacred Heart Parish continues to support this much needed project that continues Fernhill's near 40-year care for our local elderly.
