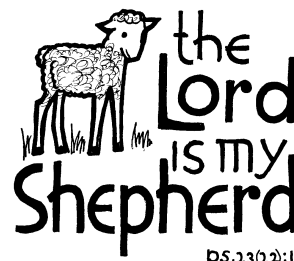

REMEMBER THE HOLY DAYS: "The Three days" - in Latin TRIDUUM—is the name given to the feast of Jesus' death and resurrection over many centuries. It begins on Holy Thursday Night with the Mass of the Lords' Supper and the Washing of Feet. It continues on Good Friday at 3pm—the time of the Lord's death and it culminates after dark on Holy Saturday Night at which we celebrate the light rising in the darkness—the resurrection of the Lord out of death. He has risen out of death, we will rise out of death. This is his gift to us.

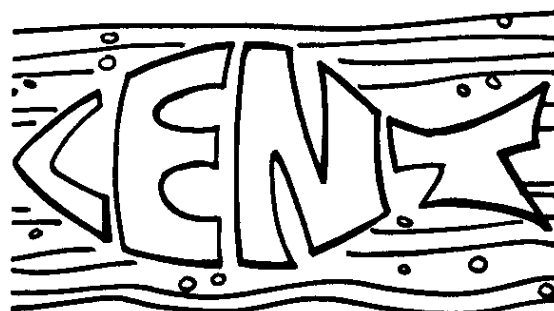
