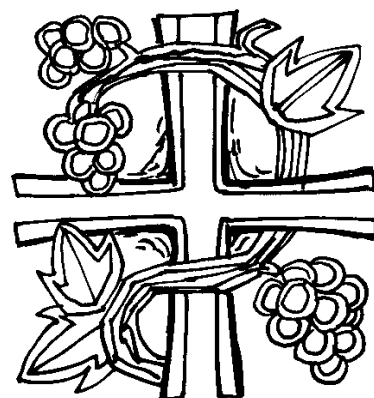

YOU CAN HELP ASYLUM SEEKERS

In recent weeks we have been highlighting the plight of asylum seekers, victims of harsh and cruel government policies. Many are denied work rights and no-one gets social security benefits during the lengthy processing of their application for asylum seeker status. They rely entirely on community support for shelter and food.

At present, accommodation for single adults, or families with adult children, is in short supply. The Social Justice Group is seeking parish support to provide such accommodation. We plan to work with BASP, who would co-ordinate the process of matching an asylum seeker with a host and ensuring the placement was successful.

- a room in your house
- a bungalow or granny flat
- a donation towards the rental cost of a suitable property

REMEXIO SCHOLARSHIPS

When Heather McGrath visited Remexio in July, she discussed priorities for education with the new parish priest, Fr Giovanni. Following these discussions, the Social Justice Group will continue to support education in the parish and surrounding areas. Scholarships will be awarded to three current Year 9 students to continue their study into the Senior School (Years 10, 11 and 12): \$120 per student per year. The students are Leonora da Costa Andrade, Joao de Andrade and Fidelio Mesquita Soares. Scholarships will also be awarded to two students from Year 12 to train as teachers at Becora Marist Teachers' College and return to teach in the local area. The students nominated are Joao da Costa Rosario and Zinho Mesquita de Andrade. These scholarships are in addition to the financial support of five volunteer teachers which our raffle has funded for many years. Sufficient funds are available to cover the cost of the scholarships and improvements to the primary school, which are still being negotiated with Fr Giovanni. He sees this collaboration as a means to develop a better future for students and teachers and is very appreciative of the support the parish has already received.
