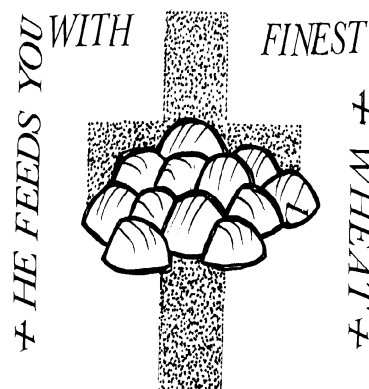

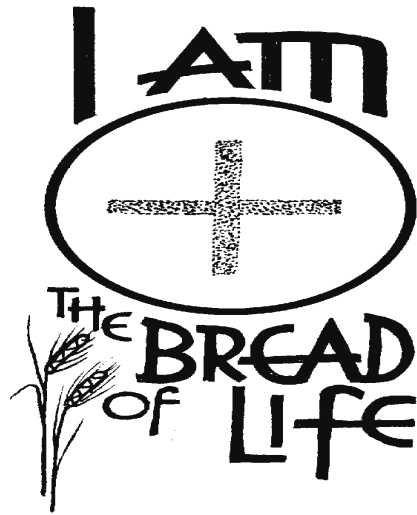
WEEKDAY MASSES THIS WEEK:

THE EUCHARIST OVER 5 WEEKS:

Once every three years in the cycle of readings at Sunday Mass, there occurs 5 Sundays when the readings come from St John's gospel, from chapter 6 of that gospel.

Now this chapter has running right the way through it, Jesus presenting himself as the Bread of Life. Its is all about himself as "BREAD".

This obviously has the consequence of making us think of the Eucharist. St. John himself moves from resenting Jesus as the Bread of Life to getting his readers to think about the Bread they are given in the Eucharist and its relationship to Jesus.

So over the remaining four Sundays (August 2nd, 9th, 16th & 23rd) we will follow St John's lead and talk and think about the Eucharist, its deep significance for us, and its centrality.
