Remexio Christmas Appeal

Our annual Christmas Appeal for the families in our twin parish in Remexio, Timor-Leste, will be launched this weekend. Members of the Social Justice Group will report on the recent visit of Heather, Judy and Pat to Remexio. We noted that many in the more remote areas outside the main village of Remexio are still living in dire poverty. As a result of our observations and discussions the SJG decided to focus on two priorities for the Christmas Appeal this year.

The first is Compassionate Care, to provide the poor people, particularly the elderly, with food packages to help them to celebrate Christmas. The second is to equip students in these communities with the necessities for starting school – backpacks containing pencils, erasers, rulers, notebooks, coloured pencils, etc.

When we visit Remexio we are always struck by the contrast between the needs of the people there and our own standard of living: what we regard as basics (food and school equipment) are not available to many.

As happened last year, fliers and envelopes will be available at Masses for the next three weeks. We ask that all donations are returned by the weekend of November 14/15 so that the money can be sent to the community and goods can be purchased and distributed in time for Christmas.

We thank you for your support of this appeal over many years and trust in your generosity again in 2015.
