SUPPORT FOR ASYLUM SEEKERS AND REFUGEES

The Social Justice Group is asking all parishioners to support those who have been silenced and marginalised by immigration detention and the refugee processing systems. There are increasing vitriolic attacks on people seeking asylum and prominent people in our community encouraging prejudice and division. Meanwhile, government policies become even more harsh and inhumane despite the harm which is being done to those who have come to Australia seeking peace, justice and a chance to begin a new life.

- The Group has produced a pamphlet, to be distributed at all Masses, outlining the "Culture of Cruelty" which pervades our detention system. The pamphlet includes the powerful article by Arnold Zable in last Tuesday's Age "Locked up with no hope". It also has suggestions for action concerned parishioners could take and a prayer for asylum seekers.

- We are also launching an appeal, in conjunction with the Primary School, to stock the pantry at the Brigidine Asylum Seeker Project. We ask for donations of cleaning products, washing powder, toilet paper and toothpaste. If you would prefer to make a donation, we will use the money to buy vouchers for Coles, KMart, Safeway etc. The appeal will close on Migrant and Refugee Sunday, August 29

We can all do something to offer compassion and hope to those who are suffering and to pressure the government to change these damaging policies.
