Meeting with TIM Wilson, MP

Members of the Social Justice Group were joined by representatives of other parishes and the Uniting Church to express our concern to Tim Wilson, Member for Goldstein, about the treatment of asylum seekers and refugees. The meeting was held on Wednesday 7 June and twenty people gathered to put specific questions to the Member regarding: the 1 October deadline for people to apply for asylum; the punitive and deteriorating treatment of those held in the Melbourne detention centres; and the conditions under which those held on Manus Island will be forced to live when the detention centre there closes. Tim Wilson displayed an excellent understanding of the issues and promised to address the issues with his colleagues. We look forward to his response. A more detailed report will be available in the coming weeks.
