PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS (OFFERTORY)

The taking of bread and wine by Christ at the Last Supper was simply a gesture of pointing out, of calling attention to these elements. In the early Christian community this action remained very simple and informal. At Rome bread and a cup of wine mixed with water were presented by the deacons to the bishop who then began the eucharistic prayer. In time the bishop said an oration over the bread and wine before beginning this prayer. The rite gradually expanded with the people themselves bringing the gifts to the altar.

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PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS (cont.) (OFFERTORY)

In the early Middle Ages there appeared various private prayers recited by the priest, some expressing his unworthiness, others tending to anticipate the meaning of the eucharistic prayer and even speaking of "offering" the gifts. As a result of these additions, the rite became quite complex and was called the offertory; in some places it was known as the "Little Canon."

The Order of Mass attempts to simplify the structure of the rite by eliminating or at least modifying many of the medieval additions. To avoid possible misunderstandings it also alters the focus of the rite which is no longer called the offertory but rather the preparation of the gifts.

The eucharistic prayer is preceded by the preparation of the gifts. The purpose of the rite is to prepare bread and wine for the sacrifice. The secondary character of the rite determines the manner of the celebration. It consists very simply of bringing the gifts to the altar, possibly accompanied by song, prayers to be said by the celebrant as he prepares the gifts, and the prayer over the gifts. Of these elements the bringing of the gifts, the placing of the gifts on the altar, and the prayer over the gifts are primary. All else is secondary.

The preparation of the altar and gifts, although the beginning of the eucharistic celebration, has a secondary character since it prepares for and leads to the eucharistic prayer. The altar is prepared; the gifts are "set apart" and presented as a sign of the community's desire to incorporate itself in the sacrifice of Christ; the bread and wine are placed on the altar as the presider praises God for his gits which will become the body and blood of the Lord; finally, in the prayer over the gifts the priest sums up the meaning of all that has taken place. The purpose of the rite is to prepare the altar, the gifts, and the community for the offering to come.
