PRESENTATION OF THE GIFTS

One of the most ancient customs of the Church is that of the people themselves providing the bread and wine for the eucharist. In third century Rome the deacons carried and presented to the bishop the gifts brought by the faithful. It has been suggested that by the fourth century the people processed to special tables in the transepts of Roman basilicas. The bread and wine which they placed upon these tables were then brought by the deacons to the altar. In seventh century Rome the pope received the bread from the aristocracy; his assistants collected bread from the others; an archdeacon received the flasks of wine.

PRESENTATION OF THE GIFTS (cont.)

As the Roman liturgy spread to other lands, this rite became a true procession of all the people who brought forth not only bread and wine but at times also oil, candles, wheat, grapes, and other items of precious value. Since this procession was a counterpart of the communion procession in which the transformed bread and wine were received back, those who presented gifts were expected to receive the eucharist.

The decrease in the number of communicants as well as the change from leavened to unleavened bread contributed to the gradual disappearance of the procession. Although traces of the procession continued down to the end of the Middle Ages, the presentation of bread and wine by the faithful was, from the eleventh century, generally replaced by the giving of money.

The Order of Mass has restored the procession in a simple form. Representative members of the assembly bring up the bread and wine as well as other offerings for the poor or for the Church.

The procession of the gifts is intended to carry on the spiritual value and meaning of the ancient custom when the people brought bread and wine for the liturgy from their homes. It is a symbolic expression of the assembly's participation in the eucharist and in the social mission of the Church.
