PRAYER OVER THE GIFTS

In the ancient Roman liturgy, once the bread and wine were placed on the altar, the bishop said a prayer over these gifts and then began the eucharistic prayer. By the eighth century and in Frankish countries a short invitation to pray, followed by silence, was introduced before the prayer over the gifts. Sometimes the invitation was addressed quietly to the assisting clergy, sometimes aloud to the whole assembly. Since the presider was requesting silent prayer, no formulated response was required. Gradually, however, a variety of spoken responses replaced the time for prayerful silence.

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PRAYER OVER THE GIFTS (cont.)

The present formula came into general use after the eleventh century. Today the priest addresses the invitation to the whole congregation which prays that the sacrifice will be acceptable and pleasing to the Father.

The prayer over the gifts was originally said aloud. The first evidence for its silent recitation comes from eighth century Frankish territory. This custom, perhaps due to eastern influence, gradually became more widespread. Whereas in Rome the formula was long known as the "prayer over the gifts," the Frankish designation was the "secret," most probably reflecting the silent manner of saying the prayer whose conclusion alone was said aloud or sung by the priest. The Order of Mass restores the prayer's original name and manner of recitation.

The prayer over the gifts concludes the preparation of the bread, wine, altar and community. Its invitation, which like similar introductions may be creatively adapted to circumstances and occasions, serves as the introduction to the prayer and articulates the sacrificial character of the Mass. The people's response indicates the assembly's link with the priest and also distinguishes a certain bipolar aspect of the liturgy: the worship of God and the sanctification of the faithful. Whereas the opening prayer is more expansive and frequently characterizes the mystery of the day or liturgical season, the prayer over the gifts is more concise. It requests divine acceptance and expresses the community's desire to unite itself with the offering to come.


