MEMORIAL

The Passover is a feast whose participants make 'memory' (zik-karon in Hebrew, *anamnesis* in Greek) of the whole saving and liberating action of God in the historical past. Since God is ever faithful to his covenant, his past deeds become present and accomplish their effects for all who share in the Passover meal. It is in the context of this religious psychology that Christ uttered his command 'Do this in memory of me'.

The whole eucharistic action and especially the words of institution are a memorial, an actual making present of God's saving deeds in Christ so that their fullness and power take effect here and now. And yet the Church from earliest times has drawn out the implications of Christ's command by a special statement called the *anamnesis* which clearly expresses the meaning of the eucharistic memorial.

This statement is closely linked to the institution narrative and normally leads to a statement of offering: Remembering.....we offer.....'. Although precise wording may vary, most traditional eucharistic prayers state that the Church makes memory of the Lord's passion, resurrection, and ascension. At times other aspects of the mystery of salvation are added: Christ's incarnation, burial, ascension, and future coming in glory.

The Roman Canon names the passion, resurrection, and ascension. The new eucharistic prayers are generally more inclusive by recalling Christ's death (II, III, IV), his descent among the dead (IV), his resurrection (II, III, IV) his ascension (III, IV) and his coming again in glory (III, IV).

By doing what Jesus has done the Church makes living memory of Christ's saving deeds. The fullness and power of the paschal mystery continue to be present as an on-going reality when the Church celebrates the eucharist. Since the eucharist is also the pledge of future glory, Christ's coming at the end of time is also anticipated.

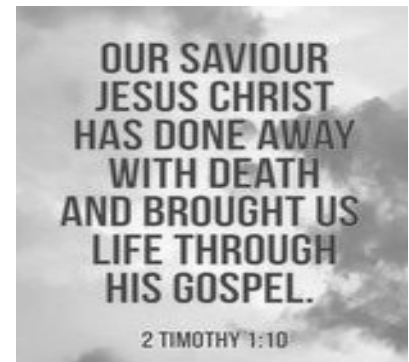
