<u>OFFERING</u>

Characteristic of all eucharistic prayers is a statement of offering. Most frequently this is linked to the anamnesis and is an explicit declaration that the Church is offering the 'bread and the cup' or some other elaborated equivalent.

Emphasis on offering and the acceptance of the gifts is a theme which occurs through the Roman Canon. While this is of value, the theme is often repeated in a very unorganized way. Before the institution narrative there are numerous requests that God accept, bless, and approve the offering and the gifts. The anamnesis, which petitions that God accept the bread of life and the cup from the many gifts he has given us, continues with a request that the offerings be accepted as were the sacrificial gifts of Abel, Abraham and Melchisedech. This is followed by a petition that the sacrifice be taken to the altar in heaven.

OFFERING

While some restricted use of sacrificial terminology occurs throughout the new eucharistic prayers, it is only in conjunction with the anamnesis that there is an explicit statement of offering. Using traditional terminology Prayer II speaks of offering 'this life-giving bread, this saving cup,' and Prayer III refers to 'this holy and living sacrifice.' the phraseology of Prayer IV is less traditional as it speaks of offering Christ's 'body and blood.' And yet there is a close union between the unique sacrifice of Christ and the sacrificial memorial of the Church which is joined to Christ. What is offered is the Church's sacrifice of praise which is the sacramental action of the offering made once and for all by Christ.

There is only one offering action in the Mass, and it is celebrated during the eucharistic prayer. It is an offering made by the whole Church but especially by the community assembled in faith. In a prayer of praise to the Father the faithful offer themselves with and through Jesus Christ, the pure and holy victim, the High Priest who joins the offering of the Church to his own. 'By offering the Immaculate Victim, not only through the hands of the priest, but also with him, they (the faithful) should learn to offer themselves too. Through Christ the Mediator, they should be drawn day by day into ever closer union with God and with each other, so that finally God may be all in all'.
