MYSTERY OF FAITH

EUCHRISTIC PRAYERS - INTERCESSIONS

The Jewish blessing prayer over the cup included various formulas requesting God to show mercy upon the people of Israel, to send Elizah and the Messiah, and to restore the house of David. It is not surprising, therefore, that at an early period the eucharistic prayer came to include intercessions for various classes of peoples. At Antioch these occurred at the end of the prayer, while at Alexandria they were placed before the institution narrative. In the Roman Canon there is a preliminary bloc of intercessions before the institution narrative which mention the Church, the pope, the local bishop, certain members of the living, and those assembled. These are followed by a list of the apostles and martyrs especially venerated at Rome. *Cont'd...*

MYSTERY OF FAITH EUCHRISTIC PRAYERS - INTERCESSIONS *(cont'd)*

The assembly, having requested the help of the unifying Spirit, quite naturally asks the Father that salvation and redemption be brought not only to its own members but to all, both the living and the dead. In this request the Church unites itself to Christ who "forever lives to make intercession" (Hebrews 7:25) for the human family. Since the eucharist is the pledge of future glory, the faithful also recall the Virgin Mary, the apostles, the martyrs, and all the saints who already share in the heavenly banquet announced and prefigured by the eucharist.


