<u>MYSTERY OF FAITH</u> <u>RITE OF PEACE</u>

Among early Christians the kiss of peace was seen as a seal placed on prayer. This gesture soon passed into the liturgy and at Rome occurred after the general intercessions which concluded the liturgy of the word. In such a position the kiss was also viewed as a sign of that mutual love required by Christ (Matthew 5:23-24) before offering sacrifice. Some time before Innocent I (401-417) Rome placed the kiss immediately after the Our Father, a position already known by St Augustine (354-430) in Africa.

MYSTERY OF FAITH RITE OF PEACE (cont'd)

The People remained in their places and exchanged the peace with their immediate neighbours. In the early Middle Ages the priest began to kiss the altar, in some places the host or chalice, and then exchanged the kiss with his assistants who in turn extended it to the members of the congregation. At this time when frequency of communion had greatly declined, the kiss was even regarded as a kind of substitute for the sacrament.

Today, the priest with extended hands, says aloud the prayer "Lord Jesus Christ." The wish for peace with the assembly's answer follows. Next the deacon or, in his absence, the priest may and normally should request all to share the peace with one another. Since the peace is to be exchanged with persons who are rather close by, neither the people nor the ministers need try exhaust the sign by attempting to give the greeting personally to everyone in the congregation or even to a great number of those present.

The Hebrew word for peace is *shalom*, namely all possible prosperity, the state of a person who lives in complete harmony with nature, self, and God. Since the risen Christ is the source of all peace, this gesture expresses faith that Christ is present in the assembly. It is both a call to reconciliation and unity as well as a seal which ratifies the very meaning of a eucharistic assembly whose members both find and pray for peace in one another.

This Sunday we begin the season of Advent and so begin to look towards the coming of Christ among us—as he did centuries ago in Bethlehem—as he keeps coming into our lives in many ways—as he comes to us in the Eucharist. And so being at Mass is so fitting a way to celebrate this lovely season of Advent.
