MYSTERY OF FAITH LAMB OF GOD

The breaking of the bread was especially lengthy in the papal liturgy. It was, therefore, accompanied by the singing of a chant which originally might have been variable. Pope Sergius I (687-701) is said to have introduced the "Lamb of God" to fill out the rite. Being Syrian, Sergius probably borrowed this chant from the Syrian liturgy. Its text is taken from the acknowledgement given Jesus by John the Baptist (cf. John 1:23,36): Christ is the Paschal Lamb (cf. I Corinthians 5:7, John 19:36) who has conquered death (cf. Revelation 5:6; 13:8).

MYSTERY OF FAITH LAMB OF GOD (cont'd)

The chant was originally sung by the people and the assisting clergy and was seemingly repeated as often as necessary to accompany the action. With the development of complex melodies it was gradually reserved to the choir. As the number of communicants decreased and as unleavened hosts replaced leavened bread, the action of breaking the bread became quite brief. As a result the text came to be sung only three times. The wording was originally unchanged at each repetition. But from the tenth century onwards the last phrase was changed to "grant us peace", probably the result of linking the chant to the kiss of peace which in the ninth century began to be transferred from before to after breaking of the bread.

Today the "Lamb of God" has been restored as a chant to accompany the breaking of the bread and the commingling. It may, therefore, be repeated as often as necessary. It is a litany-song of the choir, cantor and/or congregation and not of the priest who is engaged in the action of breaking.

The "Lamb of God" is a litany-song designed to accompany an action. Hence its function is effective only when there is bread to be broken. Jesus is the Lamb of the new Covenant. We "were delivered......by Christ's blood beyond all price: the blood of a spotless, unblemished lamb" (I Peter 1:18-19). Every eucharist is a memorial of the new Passover which brings forgiveness of sin, peace of mind and soul.
