MYSTERY OF FAITH COMMUNION RITE

In the earliest celebrations of the eucharist the bishop had no fixed formula to say after the people's Amen which concluded the eucharistic prayer. Once the bread was broken, ministers and faithful received the body and blood of the Lord.

The growing desire to express such dispositions as mutual love, unity, and forgiveness resulted in an initial expansion before the reception of the eucharist. By the early fifth century the Lord's Prayer and the sharing of the peace were established parts of the rite. Following centuries saw the addition of other expressive ceremonies and prayers.

MYSTERY OF FAITH COMMUNION RITE (cont'd)

The actual communion of ministers and people long remained quite simple. From at least the third century a short formula accompanied the faithful's reception of the eucharist, a practice which at Rome seems to have fallen into disuse by the early Middle Ages. By the sixth century a song to accompany the procession was added. It was only outside Rome and beginning about the tenth century that various formulas to introduce and accompany the communion of priest and people gradually entered various liturgical books. But by the thirteenth century communion by the faithful, other than at the moment of death, was on the point of disappearing.

The rites of preparation for communion are a structural link between the eucharistic prayers and the reception of the eucharist. They are to lead directly to the communion of the people. Their purpose is to prepare the whole assembly for its participation in the Lord's body and blood. Mutual love and reconciliation are the seeds and fruits of the sacrament shared in communal fashion by ministers and people.


