LENT-EASTER

The first celebrations of Easter were a matter of a few days. Christians would gather on the day before Easter, perhaps even from the Friday evening (death of Jesus). They would fast and then they would take part in an all night vigil on the Saturday evening. This of course involved fasting, listening to the scriptures, long times of prayer both together and as individuals. They stayed together until the cock crowed announcing the coming of dawn. At that time they would begin their celebration of the Resurrection.

LENT-EASTER (cont)

The dawning of the sun was seen as a symbol of Christ's rising out of death. As the sun rises everything on earth changes and so they saw it as a fitting symbol of Christ's defeat of death. So the pairs "life/death" and "light/darkness" became associated and are still significant in our celebration of Easter. The first part of the Easter Vigil is the Liturgy of light, involving the Easter Fire and Easter Candle both lit in darkness.

They celebrated the Resurrection by celebrating the Eucharist at dawn; it is in the Eucharist that we come to recognise the Lord who is risen among us. As the two disciples on the road to Emmaus said; they recognized Him in the breaking of the bread. (Luke 24.13-35) The Eucharist is always the culmination of the celebration of Easter.
