ONE FEAST : THREE DAYS

Have you noticed that the three ceremonies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday night have different endings and beginnings?

On Holy Thursday night, we begin as usual with an entrance hymn etc. but the ending of the Mass is 'fuzzy'. Some people stay to pray, others leave, some stay for a while, others far longer. But we leave in a disorganized manner.

The next day—Good Friday—the beginning of the liturgy is different. The priest just enters and prostrates on the ground and we all fall to our knees. At the end, there is no real ending, we go when we are ready— no final hymn, no dismissal. The priest leaves in silence and so do we.

ONE FEAST : THREE DAYS (cont)

At the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night, we gather when we are ready at the Easter fire in the school grounds and follow the Easter Candle into the Church. We end the Easter Mass as usual with a dismissal with Alleluia's attached and a hymn.

There is a reason behind these different beginnings and endings. It is to show that all of the three liturgies belong together, they run into each other. It is as if we have not been away at all, but just continue on.

We didn't celebrate the Last Supper, then Jesus' death, then his resurrection as three separate things, but as three events flowing into each other. We are celebrating his resurrection in and through his death.

This is why those three days are called "The Tridium" which is a Latin term meaning the three days that are one, one feast of his death and resurrection.
