Each year we have a Catechumenate, that is a year long process by means of which adults who are interested in the Catholic Faith are baptized, or received into the Church if they are already baptized.

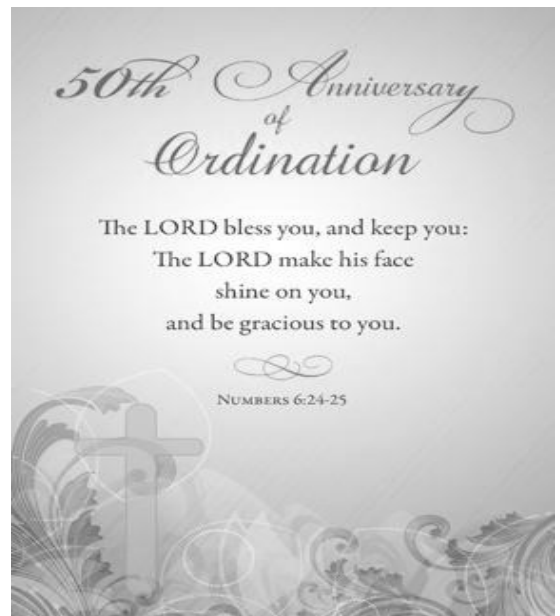
