

SHARING OUR GOODS

From Old Testament times onwards, believers have been called upon to share their material goods. It has a depth to it, it is not just a matter of sharing our surplus. Behind this is the acknowledgement that all we have comes to us from God and that he gives in order that we in turn give. We seek to show in our sharing of what we have, a reflection of God 's goodness to us.

Our goods can, on the other hand, be a barrier between us and God. We can find out deepest sense of security in what we have rather than in our relationship to God. By grasping what we have to ourselves, there is an implied lack of trust that God will keep us in his care.
