

# **Plenary Council Themes**

The Parish Leadership Group recently outlined the themes which were developed from the submissions to the Plenary Council. Each of the six themes will be explained in greater detail in the parish bulletin over the coming weeks. Further information is available from the website: www.plenarycouncil.catholic.org.au

#### Theme 2 : Inclusive, participatory and synodal

A desire for individuals and groups within and also beyond the Church to find a better welcome and be incorporated more into her life and mission. There was a call to renew forms of governance and leadership in the Church, to find ways formally and informally of being co-responsible for ministry and mission, seeking structures and processes of collaboration, shared decision-making and financial co-responsibility in order to enable this greater involvement of lay people particularly of women, young people, people of diverse cultural backgrounds and people with disabilities. There was an expressed need for stronger connections across the many parts of the Church, and with other Christian traditions.

#### Fr Laurie McNamara :

Will be filling in for Fr Frank while he is away. Fr Laurie is a Vincentian Priest, who is involved with Catholic Theological College. He was with us last year while Fr Frank was away. Sr Brigid, from the Brigidine Asylum Seeker Project, was very happy to accept our donations of cleaning products for asylum seekers and refugees, which were delivered last Monday. Sr Briaid explained that people in need can often get food from other agencies, but there is a real need for the types of goods so generously donated by you, the parishioners. Cash donations totalled \$315 and this will also be put to good use. Thank you again, most sincerely, for your generous support.
