Plenary Council Themes

The Parish Leadership Group recently outlined the themes which were developed from the submissions to the Plenary Council. Theme 3 : Prayerful and Eucharistic

Participants deeply treasured the Eucharist and the sacramental and liturgical life of the Church. There was a call for stronger and more engaging preaching, with an emphasis on the Word of God and connection to daily life, some seeking a uniquely Australian expression of prayer and Eucharistic celebration, drawing from the wisdom and rituals of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and also bringing together the many migrant communities which make up the Church in Australia. There were many divergent expressions of ways in which people and communities encounter God through their experiences of prayer, music and liturgy and a desire for catechesis, training and formation for those in ministries related to these.

Remexio Christmas Appeal

As advised in last week's parish bulletin, the annual Christmas Appeal for the families in our twin parish in Remexio, Timor-Leste, will be launched this weekend. Heather McGrath will report on her recent visit to Remexio, where she continued to develop the relationship between our two parishes.

This year, we again prioritise the needs of the poorest people in the more remote villages: for the elderly and the ill, packages of food and other goods to help them to celebrate Christmas; for the children, back-to-school and hygiene packs. The Dominican Sisters in Remexio will distribute these items.

Fliers and envelopes will be available at Masses for the next three weeks. We ask that all donations are returned by the weekend of October 26/27. The money can then be sent to Remexio and goods can be purchased and distributed in time for Christmas. We thank you for your support of this appeal over many years and trust in your generosity again in 2019.

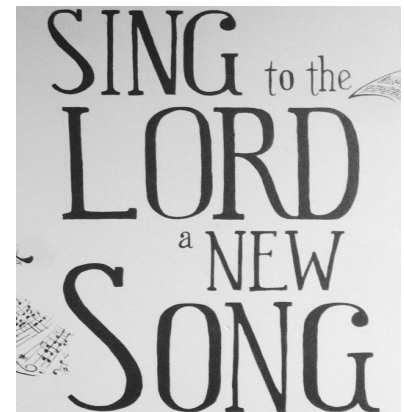
