

Plenary Council Themes

The Parish Leadership Group recently outlined the themes which were developed from the submissions to the Plenary Council. Theme 3: Humble, Healing and Merciful

People expressed a deep and faith-filled trust in God and a need for lament and healing within the Church, acknowledging the sexual abuse crisis as a turning point for the Church in Australia. It identified the need for relationship and reconciliation among many within the Catholic community, and with the wider Australian society, particularly with Australia's First Peoples and with all of creation. A desire was expressed for stronger prayer and sacramental life and more effective outreach to those who seek healing, as a renewed openness to and sign of God's Mercy.



REMEXIO CHRISTMAS APPEAL
