

Plenary Council 2020 (update) – Stage 2 Listening & Discernment

The next stage of the Plenary Council 2020 is listening and discernment : How is God calling us to be a Christ centred Church? Six themes were identified from the Listening and Dialogue stage and the Council has invited groups to now reconvene and undertake further discussion.

Listening and Discernment is a practice of prayer, contemplation, sharing with one another and seeking God's direction. The theme chosen by the Parish Leadership Group is "A joyful, hope-filled and serving community". This theme is not only relevant to the greater Catholic community, but also to the Sacred Heart community.

This theme identifies the following discussion points from stage 1 : There was a yearning for the Church to be a sign of God's kingdom for all people in Australia – to be able to see the Catholic Church in action, and to recognise Jesus. There was an expression of faith-filled hope in the capacity of the Catholic community to celebrate together, to show what it is to be a follower of Christ and to be loved unconditionally by God.

There was a call to contemplate the Gospel call to be a servant Church for the good of all people in Australia – particularly for refugees and asylum seekers and other people who are vulnerable or at risk. Many responses called for greater sharing of the story of the good works done by so many people and organisations of the Church. Some responses expressed a hunger for strong witness of faith, especially by priests, young people and female leaders in parish and school ministries.

Discussion groups for the Listening and Discernment phase will take place as follows: Wednesday 19 February 2020 at 2pm : Thursday 20 February 2020 at 7pm.

We will invite parishioners in the New Year to nominate their preferred group in the new year.

Both sessions will take place at the Church. Each Discernment session is expected to result in a response that can be summarised and submitted online by the group leader. The PLG thanks Judy Lamb for her presentation to the group and keeping us up to date with the process.


ASSISTANCE WITH CHURCH SHOP URGENTLY REQUIRED :
