We may have **20** people at that Mass. There is no need to ring about attending that Mass. Over the last two weeks we have been allowed 10 people and have not fulfilled that quota.

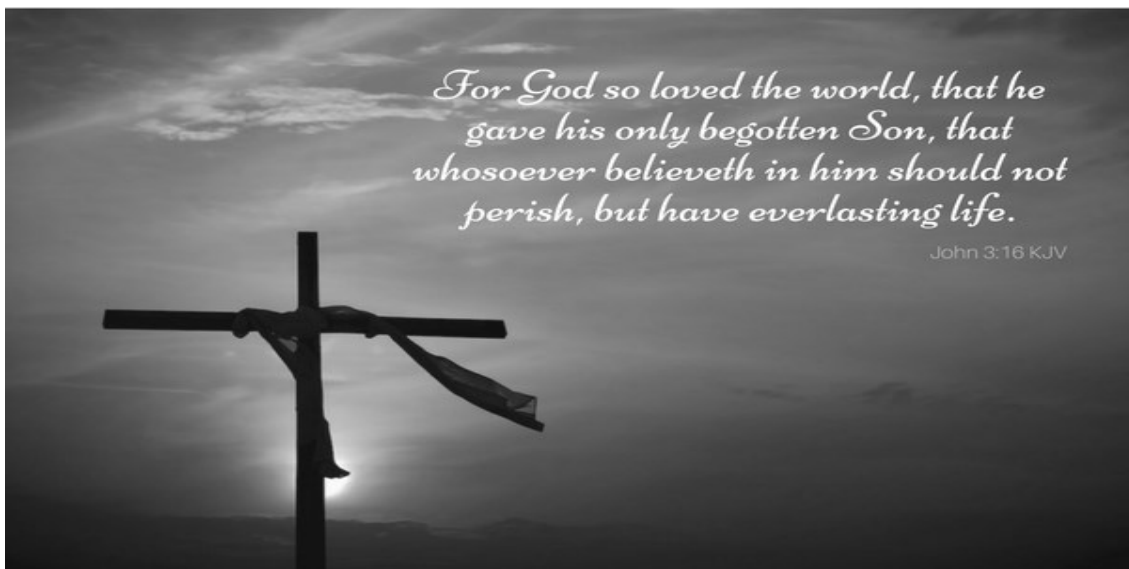
For those who do not have access to the website, there will be copies of the Readings for each Sunday Mass, available on the white board at the front doors of the Church.
