

CHANGED REGULATIONS FOR ATTENDING MASS:

From next Sunday—June 28th—we will be able to have 50 people at each Mass. Members of the Leadership Group will be at each Mass to facilitate the taking of names and contact details of those attending (to ensure our limited umbers), to organize the cleaning of the Church after each Mass and to help out with any questions or difficulties.

We will have three Masses from week: usual next as Sunday evening at 5pm 6pm). (please note not Sunday morning at 9am and 11am.
